INVENTORY.

Dear Sir:

In order to know exactly what the Sterling Co. has sold, comprising this inventory, please at your earliest convenience take a detailed and accurate inventory of all material whether old or new grouping same accordingly, and also a complete list of all the tools etc., in fact everything that is taking over as the bill of sale must contain all this.

I am asking Mr. Jones to add to said list the items which have been paid for.

This Inventory list should be in triplicate, mailing one copy to me, one to Mr. Jones and retain the other yourself. Please do this as quickly as you can so that matters can be straightened out, as Mr. Jones severs his connection with the Sterling Co., on Sept. 29 to engage in a new enterprise, after which date he will not be available as he is leaving the city. It depends therefore on your getting this inventory in our hands as quickly as possible. Kramer & Patzwahl that I will be prepared to discuss matter of business when I get up, meanwhile hustle them along to finish the roadster body.

I do not consider it necessary to unpack any of the new material that is cased, for which we will depend upon the invoices.
